CAN MEN READ?

For over ten years now I have been a happy member of our Book Group 2. I have read many books that I would not otherwise even had heard of. I have enjoyed discussing even those books I did not particularly like. The hospitality in members' homes has been great.

One thing I cannot help noticing, however. For almost the entire time I have been the only male in the group. I understand that the other Lisburn u3a book group has the same problem (if they regard it as a problem!) We did have one other intrepid man for a year or so, but why has no other male joined?

Sean Bythell, in his renowned "Diary of a Bookseller", asserts that the majority of fiction is bought by women, while men rarely buy anything other than non-fiction. Apparently, the novelist Ian McEwan conducted an experiment in which he gave away free copies of one of his books during a busy lunchtime. Almost all of those who showed appreciation were women, while those who responded with suspicion were nearly all men.
