- Storage devices, hard drives, memory cards, pen drives.
- What are the common 'computer programs' and how do we use them.
- Some things we should be cautious of, data loss, scams, computer viruses and how to avoid them.

This all sounds very complicated, but remember, we are only learning the words; we're not going to build a computer!
